Have you ever looked forward to something, and then everything seemed to go wrong? Josiah was so excited when Shaphan came with the scroll from the temple, but then ...

Shaphan went back to King Josiah to tell him about the work being done on the temple. "The builders have done a great job," Shaphan said. "They used the money to rebuild the temple, bought the materials, and paid the workers." Then Shaphan added, "Hilkiah, the high priest, gave me a book." He showed a scroll to the king.

King Josiah asked, "What is on this scroll?"

Shaphan replied, "This is the Book of the Law that was lost during your grandfather's time."

King Josiah sat up straight and his eyes got big. "Really?" he said, smiling. "This is wonderful! Please read it to me."

As Shaphan read the scroll, King Josiah listened carefully. But soon, Josiah's smile faded, and he began to frown. He was so upset that he started to cry, and then he jumped up and tore his clothes. The scroll said that the Israelites would be punished for their sins, even though Josiah had tried so hard to help them do what was right.

Josiah said to Shaphan, "We must ask the Lord about these words. I know God is angry because of what my father and grandfather did. They led the people to do wrong. Find out what will happen to the people who are alive today."

So Shaphan and some other men went to see the prophet Huldah. When they arrived at her house, they read to her what the king had heard. They asked, "Huldah, please explain this to us. What do these words mean?"

Shaphan took Huldah's message back to King Josiah. King Josiah realized that he couldn't stop the punishment from happening, but he could delay it. He decided to help the people follow God and teach them to help their families do the same. He called all the people together, including the older leaders and the priests. Together, they went to the temple, and Josiah read the Book of the Law to them.

King Josiah then said, "My people, I want to follow the Lord and obey all His commands. Will you promise to do the same?" And the people replied, "We will! We will obey the Lord, our God."

God wants us to make the same promise today, and He will guide us as we study and obey His Word.
